Management Summary-Sea Gull Lake

- Lake Trout and Walleye are the primary management species (2017 Management Plan)
- Current management goals: Maintain a minimum Lake Trout catch of 1.0 fish/deep gill net set. Maintain a minimum Walleye catch of 3.0 fish/shallow gill net set. For Walleye, maintain a minimum of 0.20 fish 24 inches or larger/gill net set (deep and shallow combined). For Lake Trout, maintain a minimum of 0.25 fish 20 inches or larger/gill net set (deep and shallow combined).
- Additional species present include Cisco, Black Crappie (first sampled in 2015), Smallmouth Bass, Northern Pike, Lake Whitefish, Yellow Perch, Burbot, and White Sucker.
- Walleye have not been stocked since 1955. Lake Trout have not been stocked since 1992.
- Current evaluations: Evaluate the Walleye special regulation implemented in 2015. Determine whether stocking is needed to improve Walleye recruitment.
- Special Regulations: Walleye, minimum size limit 17", possession limit 3. This regulation is intended to improve Walleye recruitment by limiting harvest of small Walleye.
- Surveys scheduled for 2018, 2021, and 2024 to evaluate effectiveness of Walleye regulation. Management plan revision planned for 2025.
